ACCOMMODATION

4th. AUSTRALIAN DOUGLAS MOTOR CYCLE TOUR

FLEURIEU PENINSULA is famed for its coastal views, secluded beaches and stunning coastal walks and unspoilt wildlife. It's a paradise for snorkelers and divers with dramatic ship wrecks and marine life, including the famed Leafy Sea dragon.

Some of the best produce and vineyards in the country are on the Fleurieu Peninsula; if you know wine names like McLaren Vale, Langhorne Creek and Currency Creek will be familiar. There are many cellar door sellers in this area along with antique and craft shops and local gourmet food producers.

Kangaroo Island is also only a ferry trip away and has many tourist attractions.

VICTOR HARBOR this township has long been a favoured holiday destination. Situated 80km South of Adelaide with a southern ocean frontage, the township offers an enjoyable experience for everyone. The panoramic views of the rugged granite landmark bluff and the well known Granite Island are stunning.

In winter the Southern Right Whales can be seen basking at Encounter Bay, only metres from the shore line.

The Horse drawn Tram takes passengers from the mainland via the 600 metre wooden causeway to Granite Island to enjoy the spectacular views looking back to Victor Harbor.

BAY TO BIRDWOOD RUN **Sunday 30th. September – 2012**

This is a one day event starting from Adelaide Shores, West Beach. The event follows a route through metropolitan Adelaide to finish at the National Motor Museum in Birdwood in the Adelaide Hills.

Only those motor vehicles built to the 31st. December 1955 are eligible to take part.

This would be an added bonus for interstate visitors to participate in or to visit the National Motor Museum on its busiest day of the year.
